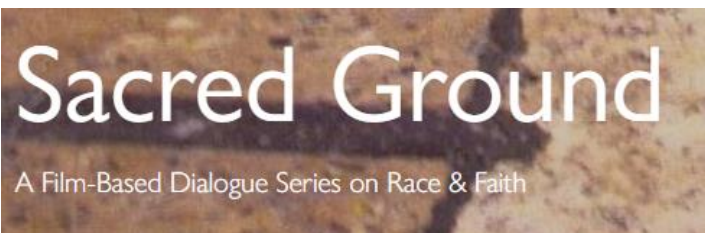
New Sacred Ground Group Forming Saint Anne's Church extends the opportunity to participate in transformational conversation concerning racial injustice.

Sacred Ground is a film and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith. It consists of 10 sessions built around an online curriculum that focuses on the histories of Indigenous, Black, Latino and Asian/Pacific American peoples. The series emphasizes personal story sharing and deepening relationships.

The *Sacred Ground series* is part of *Becoming Beloved Community*, the Episcopal Church's long-term commitment to racial healing. Open to all, the series is especially designed to help white people discuss racial issues with other white people.

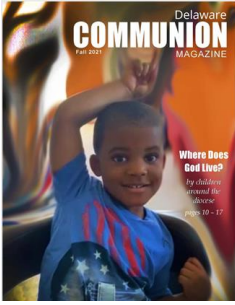

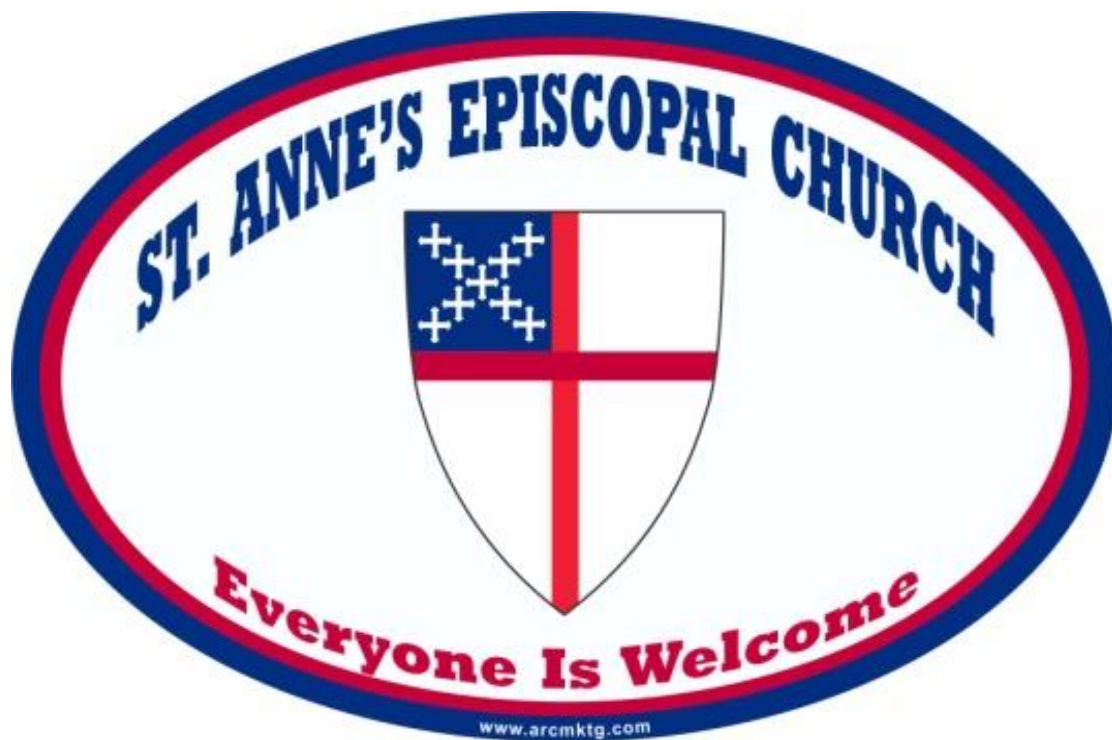
